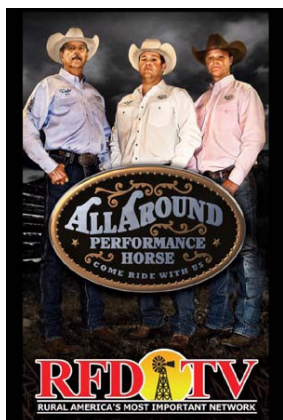

SUMMER SHOWING TIPS FOR TEXAS

In Texas, heat is a part of life this time of year. Like all bad weather, the trick is be prepared and be smart. Here are some tips for keeping you and your horse safe during summer SHOT shows:

- Travel during the cooler parts of the day, especially when your route takes you through major cities and roads, where an unplanned traffic jam could cause major heat stress for your horse
- Warm weather brings about increased wasp activity—remember to give your trailer a quick check for active nests before loading up and hitting the road
- Pack stall fans, electrolytes, and have some water handy in your trailer for you and your horse in case of delays on the road
- If you have a break during the day, take the time to unsaddle your horse to let his back dry, and give him plenty of opportunities to drink fresh water throughout the day.
- Water is great for cooling off a horse, but remember water and sweat only work when they evaporate—if your horse is still wet or sweaty after 30 minutes of rest, move him to a place where more air is circulating
