Eligibility & Division FAQ

Is there a Youth Class for riders who want to go down the fence?

Youth riders who have reached the level of full fencework are encouraged to participate in the Non Pro All Around. The Non Pro is not just for adult riders! Many youth-aged riders have competed in the Non Pro division throughout the history of SHTX, and it is the natural progression of the SHTX skill level system for Youth riders to advance into the Non Pro.

Do my earnings in a breed association (like AQHA) count?

Yes! Money won at an AQHA event (including an AQHA-approved show that pays money, the AQHA world show, VRH World, APHA World Show, etc) counts toward SHTX eligibility.

How can I find out how much money I have won?

EquiStat is the primary reporting body that SHTX uses for earnings verification. QData, AQHA & APHA records are also used as verification of points and earnings.

- 1. To search EquiStat, Go to EquiStat.com
- 2. Search For Report > Category > Individual Rider
- 3. Report Type > Rider
- 4. Enter a last name

I won the all around at a weekend show in my hometown. Does that impact my eligibility? That depends... if the show is approved by a national organization (ASHA, NRSHA, etc), then yes, it can impact your eligibility in SHTX.

I earned several AQHA points when I showed as a youth rider 25 years ago. But I haven't shown since then. Those points don't count, right? SHTX looks at lifetime accomplishments. However, there is a 10-year lookback rule. allowing a rider to step down one division with approval from the SHTX Board.

I have breed association points in Novice / Level 1 / Rookie. Do those count? SHTX looks at full-level points, not novice or level 1 points for eligibility.

Please call the office if you have eligibility questions! Page 27-28 of the SHTX Rule Book has complete eligibility information. If a rider is found to be ineligible, he/she will be disqualified and must forfeit all prizes, earnings and entry fees.



Did you know that SHTX has a Media Policy?

To protect our members, our events and our horses, the SHTX Board adopted a media policy.

Kev Points:

- Horse owners & family members can shoot cell phone video and cell phone photos of their own horses at all shows.
- Anyone using professional camera equipment (lens 4" or longer, tripod, etc) must sign a Media Agreement in the show office before taking any photographs. Rules allowing professional camera equipment vary depending on the show.

STALLING IN 2022

SHTX will manage stalling at most shows in 2022. We know stalling with your friends is a big part of the fun for each show, and we encourage that! However, accommodating all the various requests, shared tack stalls, etc. is overwhelming. Last year, it took 13 HOURS per SHOW to do stall assignments.

So to simplify things for the office in 2022, here are the rules for stalling.

If you want to share a Tack Stall or be stalled right next to a friend, those stalls must be purchased by one person all under one name

If you want to be stalled **NEAR** a friend/trainer: Put that information in the Notes. We will do the best we can to get you in the same general area. You must choose the same barn when ordering if different barns are available.

These rules will apply at all SHTX shows, even those where the facility handles stalling. They struggle with assignments and getting everyone near their friends just like we do, so this will make it better for everyone.

Please work with your friends and get a plan!

How will it work? Here's some examples:

- Suzie, Sally and Joe all want to share a tack stall. <u>Suzie needs to purchase all the</u> stalls (horse and tack) needed for their group. **Stalls will all be under Suzie's name**.
- After Suzie bought stalls, Fred decided to go to the show and wants to also share their tack stall. No problem. SUZIE needs to go online and buy additional stalls for Fred. That way everything is under Suzie's name.
- Bobby wants stalls near Suzie, Sally and Joe but does not need to share a tack stall. Bobby can buy his own stalls in his own name and put "Near Suzie" in the Notes. SHTX will get them in the same general area, but it may not be on the same row or right next to Suzie.
 - **Bobby should NOT put "Near Joe" in the Notes in his stalls because Joe did not buy stalls. There is no order in Joe's name, so there's no way to put Bobby near Joe.
- Want to be stalled in the same general area as your trainer / your barn, but your trainer does not want to purchase everyone's stalls? Not a problem. Put "Near XXX" and we will put all those in the same general area; however they may not be on the same aisle.

Approved individuals will be listed on the SHTX Website under a new section of Resources that will include their contact information, the focus of their business, etc. We have plans to include a map to make it easy to find a Stock Horse Professional in your area. The Resources page will also offer approved Stock Horse Professionals the opportunity to list upcoming stock horse clinics.

Open riders who competed at SHTX events in 2020-2021 will receive an application via email in early February. If you are interested in the program and don't recieve the email, please call the SHTX office at 855-846-7468.

There will be a meeting on the Stock Horse Professional program on Friday, March 4 at 3:15pm (after the clinic and right before the Ranch Cutting) at the Bryan show.



We lost a tough, brave cowgirl when Darlene Isbell Hicks of Hawley, Texas, died on July 10, 2011. She never rode a horse until after she married Thomas Hicks, but she soon loved to ride and show horses. She learned to team rope with her husband and also enjoyed wagon driving. Darlene was a member of Stock Horse of Texas Association, Texas Draft Horse Association and American Stock Horse Association. She was diagnosed with colon cancer in 2000. While fighting cancer, she showed in Stock Horse of Texas competitions on several different horses. She won buckles, bronzes, a saddle and she was SHTX

Reserve Champion Limited Non-Pro for 2010. One saying that gave Darlene encouragement during her battle was, "courage is being scared to death - but saddling up anyway."

In her honor, the Darlene Hicks Scholarship fund was established. This scholarship is awarded to a graduating high school senior. Applications are due February 1, and can be found on the SHTX website in the Scholarships section.

A former competitor and member of SHTX, Dr. Josie Coverdale, passed away in February, 2016 from a car accident. She was known for her passion for her career, her students, her selflessness and her character. In her memory, a SHTX scholarship has been established by her friends. The scholarship will be presented to a TAMU student who shows at the SHTX World Show and embodies the same hard work, excellence and pleasant demeanor that Josie shared with everyone.
